West Palm Beach's Nora District adds four new exciting tenants

The Nora District construction is progressing for the new dining, shopping and entertainment section north of downtown West Palm Beach.

There's a charming new neighborhood rising out of the ground in a <u>former warehouse district</u> near downtown West Palm Beach.

Once-gritty industrial buildings, some with garage-sized bay doors, have been brought to life for use as bright, open spaces for new restaurants, shops and more along North Railroad Avenue west of Dixie Highway.

The buildings are part of the newly created <u>Nora</u> dining, shopping and entertainment district, the largest planned redevelopment in West Palm Beach since CityPlace.

Nora was originally set to open this spring, but now a few retailers will open this summer, with the project's overall grand opening set for the fall.
