Where To Eat

[Café Med](#)

As the sister to the iconic Bice Ristorante, this Italian dining destination brings a Mediterranean sensibility to classic recipes made with fresh, locally sourced ingredients. From burrata and octopus to cacio e pepe and rigatoni vodka, the menu balances housemade pastas with prepared seafood. *6611 S. Dixie Hwy., West Palm Beach*

Tuscan-inspired cuisine and a strong wine program anchor this West Palm Beach staple, where Italian classics take on a subtle coastal influence. Days move between three pools, the spa and a full slate of on-property dining, with access to the Jack Nicklaus-designed Dutchman's Pipe Golf Club adding to the appeal. 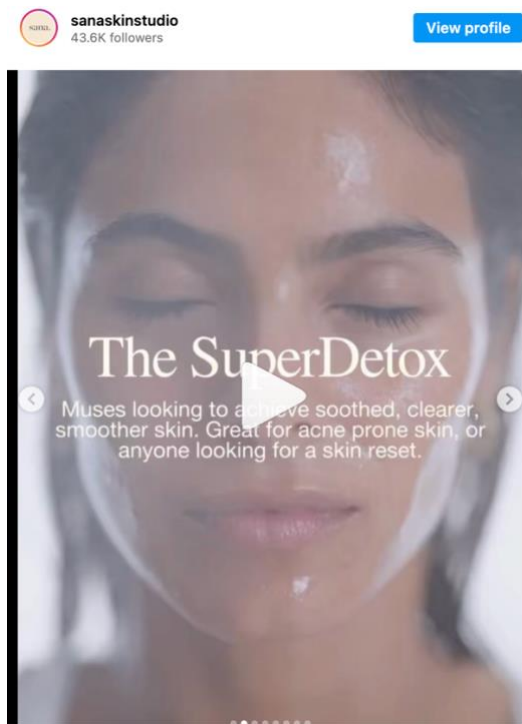

A tucked-away oasis in West Palm Beach, the Ann Norton Sculpture Gardens offers a quieter, more intimate way to experience art. Set across a two-acre historic property, the space combines the artist's former home and studio with lush tropical gardens and more than 100 sculptures, creating a setting where art and landscape feel fully intertwined.
